When I talk with people in the community – at city hall, the Chamber of Commerce, the schools, and library programs – I often hear how "We LOVE our library!" Well I do too, and so does the library staff!

When the fire department needs a new fire truck, the chief communicates that need. Like other community services, such as the fire department, when something is needed in the library, it is incumbent on the director to communicate that need and advocate for it. As I pointed out in the January newsletter, our library is in need of program and meeting space.

The State Library of Ohio collects statistics on public libraries in Ohio. In the survey for 2015, they asked whether the library had meeting rooms available to the public for free. Out of 23 public libraries with similar sized service area populations (CFPL's is 13,248), only 2 said no: Canal Fulton Public Library, and Napoleon Public Library in Henry County. The CFPL is the smallest in either Stark or Summit County, and the only library system without a program/meeting room.


In February 2016, the Board of Trustees asked library staff what we needed in additional space. Replies included a space for library programs, office space for department managers, and space for storage of program supplies and equipment. We also need to be able to provide the public with handicapped accessible board meetings, and rest rooms.
