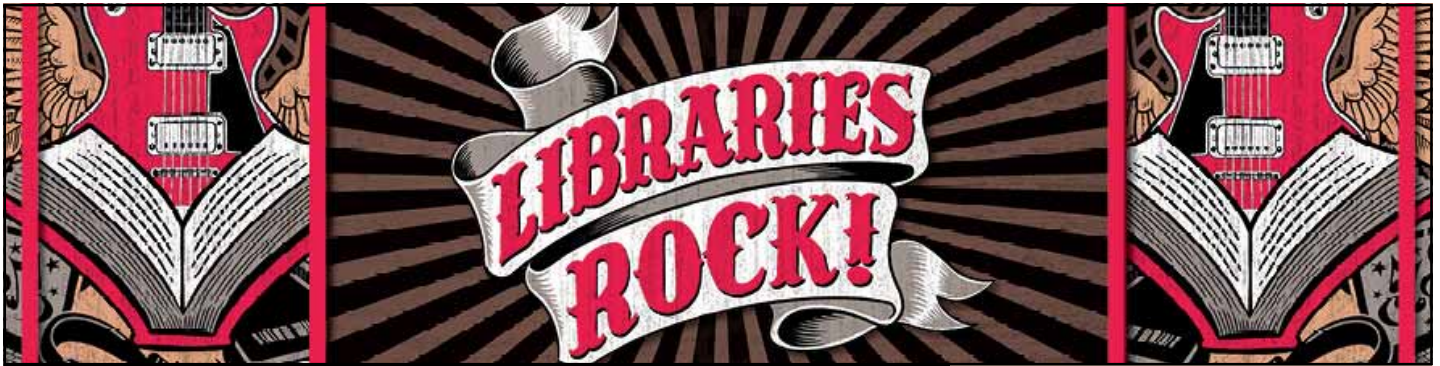

3. Autel AutoLink-Use it to diagnose your check engine lights on your car.



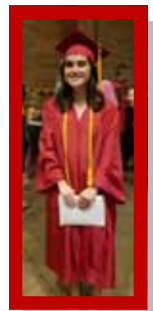
